Special Travel and Hotel Arrangements

CNS HAWAII TRAVEL AND HOUSING CONTROL CENTER

For the 23rd Annual Meeting in Honolulu, CNS has established a special Travel and Housing Control Center with the Beltz Organization of San Francisco and Honolulu, one of the country's leading coordinators of travel and housing arrangements for organizations holding meetings away from the U.S. Mainland. It is recommended that our members make all airline and hotel arrangements, including personalized itineraries, through this special office. All commitments that have been made with the airlines and hotels for the Honolulu Meeting are being coordinated by the Control Center in behalf of CNS. Members who wish to make special travel plans for their visit to Hawaii are advised to indicate their requirements directly to the Control Center as they are prepared to provide prompt confirmation of all arrangements, and will do so without a service charge or fee.

The control Center is assigned responsibilities for master coordination of all services related to the Honolulu Meeting, and the comfort of our members throughout their stay in the Islands. The use of these facilities will result in substantial benefits to CNS, its attending members and their families.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS IN HAWAII

Through the Travel and Housing Control Center, blocks of hotel rooms are being held at the Sheraton Waikiki Hotel, reserved exclusively for those attending the 23rd Annual Meeting in Honolulu. Additional blocks of rooms are being held at a number of hotels throughout the Neighbor Islands for those who wish to visit the other Islands prior to the meeting in Honolulu. Rooms will be automatically confirmed and guaranteed by the CNS Travel and Housing Control Center preferentially by the date deposits are received. The Travel Program offers these hotel accommodations at special meeting rates.

FLIGHT ARRANGEMENTS TO HAWAII

In order to take advantage of special rates, where applicable, and to afford members the opportunity and convenience of traveling to Hawaii together where possible, the Control Center has reserved certain flights to Hawaii. These flights take advantage of the lowest air fares available. If the scheduling offered is not convenient, other flights will be arranged, but there are lower travel costs possible if these schedules are used.

REGISTRATION

The Control Center will confirm all hotel and air reservations upon receipt of the Registration/Reservations form,

with deposit, and at that time will advise the total cost of the arrangements, including Registration Fee. When billed by the Control Center, the charges shown will include travel and hotel arrangements and Registration Fee.

DEPOSIT

A hotel deposit of \$50 per person is required to make reservation for the Hawaii Travel Program. If reservations are requested for the optional Neighbor Island programs, no additional deposit is required. These deposits are fully refundable as outlined on page 23 of this booklet.

SPECIAL SERVICE DESK

The Travel and Housing Control Center will maintain a Special Service Desk at the Sheraton Waikiki throughout the Congress exclusively for the convenience of the membership. This desk will be manned by professional travel personnel who will assist in making additional travel arrangements, confirmation of return air reservations and meeting the general travel requirements of the members. The Service Desk will also coordinate arrival transportation and handle all hosting activities connected with the travel program.

PRE-CONGRESS TRAVEL PROGRAMS

The CNS Control Center has arranged five optional travel programs visiting the Neighbor Islands or Oahu preceding the 23rd Annual Meeting. Four of these programs feature a presentation of Scientific Meetings during their visit to the Island of Maui from September 26 to 28. An opportunity to enjoy both golf and tennis, and maybe some competition, will be presented during the stay at the Royal Lahaina Hotel on Maui or at the Makaha Inn and Country Club on Oahu. Reservations for these optional programs should be made through the CNS Control Center at the time registration is made for the Congress. Your stay in Hawaii will be greatly enhanced by taking advantage of these special visits to the "Outer Islands".

SPECIAL INDIVIDUAL ARRANGEMENTS

All requests for individual services, such as special flights, additional hotel nights or special arrangements in Hawaii, should be directed to the CNS Travel and Housing Control Center. They will be handled promptly and to your specifications. There is no service charge for making special arrangements, which will be invoiced to you at the same time as the Congress and Registration costs.

RESIDENTS

There will be a Special Travel Program for the Residents attending the CNS Honolulu Congress. Full details will be included in a special mailing to Residents.

Airline Flights and Information

ADVANTAGES OF USING CNS FLIGHTS TO HAWAII

Certain regularly scheduled flights have been selected by the Travel and Housing Control Center for flights between Mainland points and Hawaii. By using these flights, registrants will be able to take advantage of the lowest available airfare in connection with their transportation to Hawaii and will have the further advantage of traveling on the same flights with fellow members. This latter consideration permits speedier airport check-in, complete freedom from baggage details on arrival and will facilitate handling of hotel formalities because of advance preparation for specific arrivals, including readiness of room.

AIRFARE INCLUDED IN THE TRAVEL PROGRAM

There is a type of airfare available from many inland cities to Hawaii which provides round trip Coach Class service at a worth-while saving over the through Coach Class fare or any combination of Coach fares to the West Coast and Thrift fares on to Hawaii. To qualify for this airfare it is required that the travel package cost be prepaid, include a minimum of six nights' stay in Hawaii, hotel accommodations each night and other ground features which are included in the CNS Travel Package.

The Travel Program Prices from inland cities displayed on page 25 of this booklet in most cases include this special Independent Tour Basing Airfare. Prices shown from West Coast gateway cities include roundtrip "Group 40" airfare.

CLASSES OF SERVICE FROM THE MAINLAND TO HAWAII

THRIFT CLASS service between the West Coast and Honolulu offers no meal service in flight, but complimentary beverages

are served (coffee, tea, milk or soft drinks) and cocktails are available at low cost. Flights on some airlines also serve tasty food snacks at a cost of \$1.50. A charge of \$2.00 is made for the use of earphones for movies or stereo. Seating space is identical in both Thrift and Custom Coach (described below), both classes of service being seated in the same rear compartment of the aircraft.

CUSTOM COACH features a hot meal and generally complimentary champagne while in flight. Cocktails are available at nominal cost. There is no charge for earphones. Those traveling from San Francisco, Los Angeles, San Diego, Portland and Seattle on the Group 40 airfare will be provided with Coach service, featuring meal service. Since fares between the West Coast and Hawaii are influenced by the day of travel, cost will be adjusted as appropriate if travel in either direction is on a day other than as featured in the Congress Travel Program. Those traveling from the inland cities shown on page 25 will in most cases find that their entire trip will be by Coach Class service.

FIRST CLASS offers complimentary champagne, cocktails, wine and liquors, beautifully prepared and served meals and more spacious seating. The additional cost on the Congress Travel Program from the West Coast is \$180.08 per person round trip. The Control Center will advise the additional cost of First Class service from other cities upon request.

SPECIAL CHARGES FOR GOLF BAGS

A golf bag may be substituted for one bag in the free allowance of two suitcases per person, i.e. a couple could have three suitcases and one golf bag without additional charge. If the golf bag is in excess of the free allowance for suitcases, there will be an excess baggage charge of \$5.00 per golf bag in each direction between the Mainland and Hawaii.

WHEN TO REGISTER AND MAKE RESERVATION FOR THE HAWAII CONGRESS

It is imperative to the success of the CNS 23rd Annual Meeting in Honolulu that you submit the Registration/Reservation form promptly.

The Travel and Housing Control Center was established to assure (1) the utmost convenience for members traveling to Hawaii by giving them an instrument through which all arrangements will be made and confirmed at the lowest possible cost in hotel and air travel through the use of group and volume rates and (2) to provide an efficiency in the actual execution of the program by providing an accurate advance reading of the number who will be in attendance. Making hotel and travel reservations through the Control Center is a firm indication of intent to participate. Thus, early advice is important so that an attendance pattern will be indicated sufficiently in advance to make whatever adjustments in plans are dictated by such a pattern. Deposit is refundable as detailed below. As you can readily understand, to plan for attendance at a given number, only to have it substantially increase by late reservations, can present serious handling problems.

REGISTRATION/RESERVATION, DEPOSIT AND PAYMENT PROCEDURE FOR HAWAII CONGRESS

A hotel deposit of \$50 per person must be submitted with the Registration/Reservation form. Final payment will be due forty-five days prior to the date of travel.

Registration costs are to be submitted when hotel deposit is made. The Travel and Housing Control Center will process your reservations promptly and will provide you with the following:

1. Confirmation of the hotel and air flights as specified in the Registration/Reservation form.
2. Confirmation of special requests, including hotel nights and air flights requested.
3. Confirmation of Pre-Congress Optional Travel Programs in the Islands when requested.
4. Invoice covering cost of basic Travel Program, Optional Travel Program, additional hotel, ground and air arrangements requested and the Registration cost.
5. Any other information pertinent to your travel arrangements.

The Travel and Housing Control Center will forward your travel packet, consisting of airline tickets, special events credentials, itinerary for your travel plans and other related materials prior to your departure.

Credit is available through many credit cards that can cover the cost of air travel. For credit information, please request the Travel and Housing Control Center to advise regarding the use of specific credit cards.

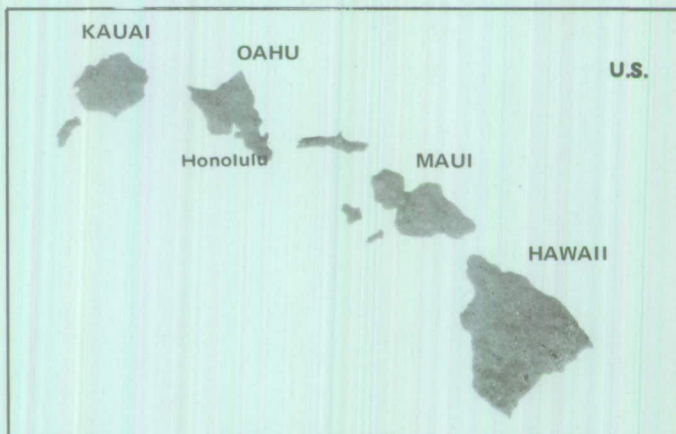
HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS PRIORITIES IN HAWAII

The Sheraton Waikiki Hotel is headquarters for the CNS 23rd Annual Meeting in Hawaii. This deluxe property offers outstanding meeting facilities, a broad variety of excellent recreational features, varied dining and services. It is located in the heart of Waikiki Beach area, close to all of its major attractions.

Being a deluxe hotel, all guest rooms in the Sheraton Waikiki are of a superior quality. However, there are those rooms which for reason of exact location and convenience are preferred over others. In order that the assignment of preferred rooms will be handled most fairly, the Travel and Housing Control Center will assign a "priority" number to each registration as the Registration/Reservation form, with deposit, is received. This number(s) will appear on your invoice. Rooms are thus assigned by priority according to the date the reservation is received at the Control Center.

CANCELLATIONS

If it is necessary to cancel your arrangements with the Travel and Housing Control Center, monies paid are fully refundable and there will be no cancellation charge. Thus, there is no risk in making early reservations. However, cancellations within 72 hours of arranged travel date could possibly result in some out-of-pocket expense, which, if incurred, would not be more than one night's hotel charge.

Prices from San Francisco, Los Angeles, San Diego, Portland and Seattle are based on a Group of 40 Passengers traveling together, Coach service with meals provided.
- * Six nights' accommodation at the Sheraton Waikiki Hotel for the period September 30 – October 6, 1973.
- * 4% Hawaii State Tax on hotel accommodations and ground transportation.
- * Private transportation round trip between Honolulu International Airport and the Sheraton Waikiki Hotel.
- * Special baggage handling upon arrival and departure, including tips to airport porters and hotel bellmen.
- * CNS Special Hawaii Service Center and staff throughout the Congress.

ADDITIONAL NIGHTS BEFORE AND AFTER THE CONGRESS

Those wishing to either arrive in Honolulu in advance of the CNS 23rd Annual Meeting or to extend their stay on adjournment should so indicate on the Registration/Reservation Form, giving dates involved. Rooms will be provided at special Congress rates.

Travel Program prices are based upon airline fares and rules governing fares in effect as of October 1, 1972, and either the fares or rules are subject to change without notice. Any change in fares will be adjusted either downward or upward as necessary on invoice.

The Group 40 airfare of \$185.07 is included in the \$299.50 Travel Program for passengers originating from San Francisco, Los Angeles, San Diego, Portland and Seattle to the Honolulu Congress and return ONLY. The regular round trip individual airfare of \$236.08, based on weekend travel, will apply when the Honolulu Congress is combined with Pre-Congress Program H-2. The regular round trip individual airfare of \$221.08, based on 1-way weekend and 1-way weekday travel, will apply when the Honolulu Congress is combined with Pre-Congress Programs H-3, H-4, H-5 or H-6.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

WEATHER AND WHAT TO WEAR

You've heard a lot about Hawaii's climate. It's all true. The temperature is ideal, the year around. Think of it as an endless June, with the thermometer ranging generally in the 70's and 80's, day and night with some high 60's in the cool season. Casual daytime wear calls for Hawaiian fashions: Aloha shirts and muumuus, all of which can be bought when you arrive. For dressier occasions, light cottons, synthetic blends and linen are always acceptable. Most of the year, evenings are cool, when you add air conditioning in theaters and restaurants, a stole or dress-up sweater can be most welcome. A windbreaker or light raincoat might come in handy when you visit the mountaintops and rain forests on the Neighbor Islands. Comfortable walking shoes are very useful.

SHOPPING

Rows of shop windows lure you with Polynesian images carved of Koa wood, hardwood inlaid trays, bowls and dishes; with native Lauhala weaving in mats, rugs, baskets and handbags; driftwood jewelry and Island food delicacies (packed to travel well for tasteful gifts) . . . Macadamia nuts, coconut chips, jellies and preserves, candied lotus roots (a Chinese favorite). Smart beach, sports and evening clothes will beckon from every shop window along famous Kalakaua Street.

A STATEMENT OF TAX REGULATIONS APPLIED TO CONVENTIONS IN HAWAII

The Honorable Daniel Inouye, Senator from Hawaii, received the following statement dated March 27, 1963, from Lester W. Utter, Chief, Individual Income Tax Branch, the Internal Revenue Service in Washington, D.C.

"The Internal Revenue Service does not approve or disapprove any localities as convention sites. The relative purpose, rather than the site, is the chief factor in determining the deductibility of expenditure for Federal Income tax purpose. There is no reason for concern about legitimate business deductions being disallowed because the business activity takes place in a resort area. Expenses which are clearly shown to be for business purposes, and which are not lavish or extravagant under the circumstances will continue to be allowable."

Special Travel and Hotel Arrangements

CNS TOKYO TRAVEL AND HOUSING CONTROL CENTER

CNS has established a special Travel and Housing Control Center for the 5th International Congress in Tokyo with the Beltz Organization of San Francisco and Honolulu. In addition to handling arrangements for the 23rd Annual Meeting in Hawaii, they are also prepared to handle all travel and housing arrangements in connection with the 5th International Congress and an optional program of Symposia, sponsored by the International Congress, and sightseeing tours following the International Congress. They are also prepared to handle any requests for individual travel arrangements to the Orient or elsewhere in the world in connection with attendance at the Honolulu or Tokyo Congresses. The programs following the 5th International Congress will all be American Plan, three meals per day.

It is recommended that this special office be used for all airline and hotel arrangements, including specialized itineraries. In behalf of CNS, the Control Center is coordinating all commitments that have been made with the airlines and hotels for the Honolulu and Tokyo Meetings. Members who wish to make special travel plans for their visit to the Orient are advised to indicate their requirements directly to the Control Center, which is prepared to provide prompt confirmation of arrangements without a service charge or fee.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS IN TOKYO

Blocks of rooms are being held at several hotels in Tokyo by the Travel and Housing Control Center for the period of the 5th International Congress. At the Imperial Hotel, New Wing, there will be a choice of twin or single rooms, full suites or semi-suites. At the Imperial Hotel, East Wing, the Tokyo Hilton Hotel and the Keio Plaza Hotel, a choice of twin or single rooms will be offered.

These varied hotels, all considered among the finest in Tokyo, provide a choice of location and price. The Travel Package Cost is based on the hotel selected. Hotel accommodations will be assigned in the order in which reservations with deposit are received, with the early reservations receiving their first choice. Because of some limit to the accommodations available at the Imperial Hotel, you are requested to indicate a second choice of hotel on the Reservation Form.

In addition, blocks of rooms are being held in various other cities in Japan and the Orient, including Southeast Asia, for those wishing to travel on any of the optional travel programs available after the Congress.

Rooms will be automatically confirmed and guaranteed by the CNS Travel and Housing Control Center preferentially by the date deposits are received. The Travel Program offers these hotel accommodations at special meeting rates.

REGISTRATION FOR 5TH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS

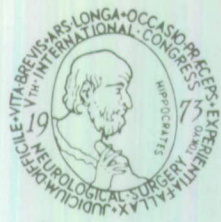
The Control Center will confirm all hotel and air reservations upon receipt of the Registration and Reservation Form, with hotel deposit and Membership Fee, and at that time will advise the total cost of the arrangements, including Membership Fee. When billed by the Control Center, the charges shown will include travel and hotel arrangements and Membership Fee.

DEPOSIT

A hotel deposit of \$100 is required to make reservation for the Travel Program plus remittance of the Membership Fee which is required for the mandatory advance registration for attendance at the 5th International Congress. If reservations are requested for the optional post-congress travel programs, no additional deposit is required. These deposits are refundable as explained on page 15.

SPECIAL SERVICE DESK AND STAFF IN TOKYO

The Travel and Housing Control Center will maintain a Special Service Desk in the lobby of each hotel throughout the 5th International Congress exclusively for the convenience of the membership. These desks will be manned by professional travel personnel who will assist in making additional travel arrangements and meeting the general travel requirements of the members. They will be prepared to assist with local information and any local sightseeing or transportation requirements. The Service Desk will also coordinate arrival and departure transportation and handle all hosting activities connected with the travel program.

CNS CHARTER FLIGHTS TO TOKYO

The Executive Committee of CNS has recognized that charter flight arrangements offer many advantages to CNS members wishing to attend the 5th International Congress. The Executive Committee, therefore, in cooperation with the CNS/Beltz Coordination Center, has arranged special CNS sponsored flights for CNS members and their immediate families. These charter flights are used for all travel programs in this booklet which encompass travel to and through the Orient and identified herein as "J-1" through "J-8."

ADVANTAGES TO CNS MEMBERS USING CHARTERS

Charter airfares are dramatically lower than those available on regularly scheduled flights, and to make these savings possible was the primary consideration of the CNS/Beltz Coordination Center. Each of the travel programs to the Orient listed in this booklet, represents a saving of \$300 to \$400 per person. As an example, the cost of the 5th International Congress Travel Program in Tokyo, following attendance at the Honolulu Congress, using the New Wing of the Imperial Hotel for 7 nights and including transfers, baggage handling and gratuities is priced at \$434.00 per person, sharing twin room. The cost of this same program using scheduled air service rather than a charter would be \$871.00 per person, sharing twin room.

These charter flights are being offered on a first come, first served, basis and as soon as they are filled requests for reservations will be on a wait-list basis if any vacancies occur. Early reservations are imperative, both to secure a charter flight, as well as your choice of hotel in Tokyo.

Charter program flights will be provided by major international airlines such as Japan Airlines, Northwest Orient Airlines or Pan American World Airways.

Should members desire to deviate from the CNS sponsored travel programs in the Orient, it will be necessary to arrange

the itinerary on scheduled flights at whatever normal excursion airfares might apply. No allowance can be made for travel one-way or part way via charter airfares. Charter fare benefits apply only for round trips and for travel on the specified flights sponsored by CNS.

In accordance with requirements in finalizing charter flights, the final payment for Orient travel programs will be due 90 days prior to departure date. However, deposits to secure reservations should be made immediately. Cancellations received 90 days or more prior to flight departure are refundable in full. In the event there is not a full charter, members will be advised at least 75 days in advance of departure of any necessary increase in the pro-rata charge per person on that charter flight. Should the charter flight not operate the programs will be operated via scheduled flights. It is important that CNS members cooperate expeditiously in arranging their travel plans so that the advantages of charter travel will be available to the largest number of CNS members and their families.

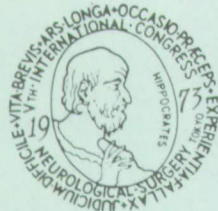
BAGGAGE WEIGHTS AND LIABILITY

Charter flight travel, which is included in the Orient travel program cost, permits a total weight allowance of 66 pounds per person. Purse, camera or coat which can be carried over your arm do not figure in your weight allowance. Although it is weighed, you may wish to carry aboard a small case or briefcase that you can stow beneath your own seat. Most airlines on the domestic portion of your flights allow you to check two bags per person without regard to weight, plus a carry-on piece that will fit under your seat.

Due to varying degrees of liability experienced in foreign countries, it is highly recommended that the value of your belongings be fully covered by baggage insurance and also include accident and health insurance. Your own insurance broker can tell you how well you are protected by your present insurance while traveling abroad. Trip health and baggage insurance is available if required.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING CHARTER FLIGHTS TO THE ORIENT

All CNS sponsored travel programs to the Orient in connection with the 5th International Congress and optional Symposia and Travel Programs after the Congress are being handled via charter flights. The prices quoted in connection with these Travel Programs are predicated on 100% occupancy of the charter flights. Under government charter regulations should there not be 100% occupancy of the airplane but sufficient occupancy to economically operate the charter, the remaining passengers then assume their pro-rata share of the total cost of the charter fare. All passengers will be advised from 90 to 75 days prior to departure whether or not there will be an increase in the pro-rata fare.

WHEN TO REGISTER AND MAKE RESERVATIONS FOR THE TOKYO CONGRESS

Inasmuch as the Membership Fee for the 5th International Congress in Tokyo increases on January 1, 1973, it is to the advantage of members to submit the Registration/Reservation Form promptly. Additionally, early advice of intent to participate in the International Congress is essential to its ultimate success.

The Travel and Housing Control Center, as its working name implies, assumes the responsibility for coordinating all travel to and from the International Congress and for housing the membership while in Tokyo. Because of the large numbers expected to attend the 5th International Congress and further, because the locale of the International Congress is in a foreign city, the function of the Control Center is of extreme importance to the membership in matters of convenience, lowest possible costs and professional planning. The Control Center is essential to the efficient functioning of the Congress itself because it will provide an accurate reporting of the numbers who will attend.

REGISTRATION/RESERVATION, DEPOSIT AND PAYMENT PROCEDURE

A hotel deposit of \$100 per person must be submitted with the Registration/Reservation form. The Membership Fee based on date of submission of the form must also be included with deposit as this advance registration is a requirement for participation in the scientific program. Final payment will be due 90 days prior to the date of travel. The Travel and Housing Control Center will process your reservations promptly and will provide you with the following:

1. Confirmation of hotel and air flights as specified in the Reservation Form.
2. Confirmation of special requests, including hotel nights and air flights requested.
3. Confirmation of Post-Congress Travel Programs in the Orient when requested.
4. Invoice covering cost of basic Travel Program, Optional Travel Program, additional hotel, ground and air arrangements requested and including the Membership Fee. Invoice will reflect the hotel deposit and Membership Fee submitted with the Registration/Reservation form.
5. Any other information pertinent to your travel arrangements.

In accordance with the areas you select to visit in the Orient, the Travel and Housing Control Center will advise the requirements you must meet with regard to passport, visas and medical inoculations. A travel packet consisting of airline tickets, special events credentials, itinerary for your travel plans and other related materials will be forwarded to you approximately two weeks prior to your departure.

CANCELLATIONS

Ground Arrangements – Generally there is no charge for cancellations except for the communication charges involved on late cancellations and the inability of hotels to resell accommodations on short notice. For hotels cancellation on less than 7 days notice can result in a charge of all or part of the one day rate. On the Symposium Tours, there will be a 10% cancellation charge for cancellations less than 21 days. The International Congress advises that no refund will be made of registration fee after September 1, 1973.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATION PRIORITIES IN TOKYO

The Imperial Hotel in Tokyo is the headquarters hotel for the 5th International Congress in Tokyo. This is a deluxe property and offers outstanding meeting facilities and a broad variety of dining and other service features. Because of the size of the International Congress and generally busy hotel season in Tokyo, it was necessary to select two additional hotels in Tokyo to insure that there would be sufficient rooms available to accommodate all who wished to attend the 5th International Congress. The Tokyo Hilton and Keio Plaza Hotels were chosen for their fine rooms and service and convenient location to the Imperial Hotel. All three of the hotels are considered among the best in Tokyo.

In order that the assignment of hotel rooms will be handled most fairly, the Travel and Housing Control Center will assign a "priority" number to each reservation as the Registration/Reservation Form, with deposit, is received. This number(s) will appear on your invoice. Rooms will thus be assigned by priority according to the date the reservation was received at the Control Center. Because of the limited number of certain rooms you are requested to indicate first and second hotel choice on the Reservation form.

GENERAL INFORMATION - THE ORIENT

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

You must have a valid passport with you throughout your trip. You can obtain a passport by applying in person at the U.S. Passport Office in Los Angeles, San Francisco, New York, Chicago, Boston, Philadelphia, Miami, New Orleans, Seattle or Honolulu. Some Post Offices are also staffed for passport applications or you can apply to any State or Federal Clerk of Court. Apply for your passport as early as possible as several days are required for processing. Passports are valid for five years from the date issued and are not renewable. If you already have a passport, check to see that it will be valid throughout the duration of your complete time in the Orient.

U.S. citizens must have a visa for entry into Japan, which can be obtained from the Japanese Consulate General in San Francisco (1601 Post Street, phone 921-8000), Los Angeles (250 E. 1st Street, Los Angeles, phone 624-8305) or New York (235 E. 42nd St., phone YU 6-3403). Those taking the optional post-Congress tours outside Japan will require a visa for Taiwan (with one photo) which should be obtained from the Consulate General in San Francisco (557 Montgomery Street, phone 362-7680), Los Angeles (448 S. Hill Street, phone 629-3369) or New York City (1250 - 6th Avenue, phone CL 6-3403). Visas are not required for Hong Kong, Bangkok, Kuala Lumpur and Singapore. Since visas sometimes take time to process, you should apply for them as soon as you get your passport.

IMMUNIZATIONS

A smallpox vaccination certificate (not less than 8 days or more than 3 years old) is required. A cholera certificate is sometimes required for visits to Hong Kong and other Orient destinations. It is recommended that you also get immunization vaccinations for typhoid and paratyphoid. These vaccinations should be done by your personal physician. He should furnish you with immunization certificates to be stamped by the Board of Health in the community where he practices. It is recommended that you contact the United States Public Health Service prior to your departure as to immunization requirements as they often vary according to local conditions at the time of travel.

SPECIAL TAXES

Governments of several countries in the Orient impose transportation taxes that are not included in the price of your travel package. These taxes are collected from you (usually at the airport) either when you enter or when you leave those countries. You will encounter such taxes in Hong Kong (approximately \$1.80 U.S.), Singapore (approximately \$1.70 U.S.), Malaysia (approximately 70 cents U.S.), Taiwan (approximately \$2.50 U.S.) and Thailand (approximately \$1.00 U.S.).

WEATHER AND CLOTHING

Japan's climate has decided seasonal changes like the East Coast of the United States. Autumn temperatures average about 55 degrees and although most rainfall is during June, some rain can be expected each month. Since Tokyo is a very modern, cosmopolitan city, your dress should be appropriate to any major U.S. city with similar climate.

Hong Kong's autumn weather is sunny and dry, with temperatures averaging 77 degrees. Bangkok's weather will be warm with the possibility of some showers, while Singapore has little seasonal change with temperatures averaging between 74 and 88 degrees, with high humidity, with Kuala Lumpur experiencing similar weather. Your clothing in these warmer climates can be more casual and should be lightweight. Nonetheless, the ladies should have a dressy sweater or stole for cooler nights. Evening wear can often be found to be dressy, so a lightweight cocktail dress or suit should be included in your wardrobe.
