SELF-ASSESSMENT EXAMINATION

As a part of the Congress meeting this year, a self-assessment examination in neurosurgery will be given under the sponsorship of the Joint Committee on Education. It will be held on October 11, 1977, from 7:00 a.m.-9:00 a.m., preceded by a breakfast from 6:00 a.m.-7:00 a.m. The cost for the breakfast and examination is \$30.00 and you may pre-register for both on the enclosed form. No other sessions will be held during this time. The examination will include questions on neurosurgery, neurology, neuroradiology, neuroanatomy, plus practical patient-care problems. Scoring will be done by the National Board of Medical Examiners who will confidentially return only to the examinee his overall score including comparison with the group as a whole and also a "key word" analysis that will allow him to identify missed questions. Twenty hours of credit for Category I toward the Physician's Recognition Award in Neurosurgery will be afforded each examinee, in addition to the forty hours credit for attendance at the Congress meeting itself.
