Membership grows dramatically after 2 years!

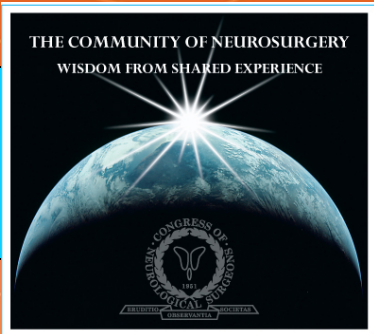
